The Phoenix Publishing Co., Dublin. No date c.1910. 1st edition thus. Crown 8vo. xx + 486 pp. Frontispiece portrait & 3 plates. Paper boards & cloth spine. A very nice clean copy with just a little fading at cover extremis.  
Jonah Barrington, was born near Abbeyleix, Co. Laois in 1760. Educated at TCD, and called to the bar in 1788, he was sometime MP for Tuam, and for Clogher from 1798 until the Act of Union in 1800. He became a judge of the Irish Admiralty and opposed the Union, while at the same time he was acting as a government agent to bribe others to vote in favour of it. He was knighted in 1807. A bit of a rogue of whom it was said "that he had the same notion of blushing as a blind man has of colours", his extravagant ways led him to misappropriate court funds, and for this he was eventually removed from office in 1830. He spent his last years in France, where he died in 1834.

Brown & Clarke 132. "A family chronicle in fiction form, names of real persons being disguised ... set at the foot of Slievenamon."  
Still highly regarded, this is the best known and most popular work by Maurice Brown (using the pseudonym Joseph Brady) who was born at Grangemockler, Co. Tipperary in 1891. Following ordination to the priesthood in 1917 he spent some time as a curate in Athy, Co. Kildare and was later P.P. of Ballymore Eustace."

In original contemporary calf, decorated in blind, which has some loss, but is repairable. A little overall looseness & some light wear at margins of prelims, else very good & clean.  
Subtitled "From the Revolution to the Conclusion of the Treaty of Peace at Utrecht, in the Reign of Queen Anne."  
This, the last of many works by Bishop Burnet, was published posthumously, as the author, who was born in Edinbrugh in 1643, had died in 1715."

Sefia, London / Lilliput, Dublin 1994. 1st edition. Post 8vo. (4) + 235 pp. Tiny nick in spine, else a very good copy in pictorial card wrappers.  
Described by Colm Tobin as "A stunningly truthful and perfectly pitched novel". It is mostly set in the Ha'penny Bridge area of Dublin, with some of the action taking place in that charming book emporium, the Winding Stair Bookshop.

Kildare Archaeological Society ? No place or date; c.1930. Off-print. Royal 8vo. Possibly an off-print from the Journal of the K. A. S. 445-452 pp. 1 in-text illustration. Slight creasing at edges, else a very good copy in plain wrappers.  
Inscribed on the front wrapper "To Dr. A. S. Corran (?) / with Compliments and Good wishes, / Michael T. Casey", the paper is described as "Presented to the Kildare Archaeological Society" so we assume that it was printed in their journal.

G. P. Warren, Dublin. No date c.1840. Stereotyped edition. 12mo. 120 pp. Recent burgundy cloth with original printed wrapper laid down on front panel. Some light wear at upper fore-edges early & late & a little soiling, but overall a good clean copy of a scarce printing.  
The author, Marie Sophie Ristaud, was born in Tonneins, France in 1770. In 1790 she married Jean-Paul Cottin, who unfortunately died quite soon after, leaving her with three children. She turned to writing as a means of support and with some success, however this novel, first published in 1806, proved her greatest hit, but she did not live to enjoy its good fortune, going to an early grave the following year.

Printed by H. Bomans, Louvaine for The Department of Education, Dublin 1928. 1st edition. Medium 8vo. iv + 10 pp. 1 in-text illustration. Couple of ex-lib stamps. Later brown cloth. Some wear at lower margin, else very good. Scarce.  
This copy has the stamps and cancelled stamp of University College library.

Catholic Truth Society, Dublin 1919. 1st edition. Small crown 8vo. 128 pp. Frontispiece portrait & 6 plates. Original pale brown decorated cloth. A little light rubbing at cover extremities, else a very good clean copy.

Edward Galvin, who was born at Newcastletown, Co. Cork, was ordained a priest at Maynooth in 1909. He gave the remainder of his life to the thankless, and totally unnecessary, task of converting the Chinese to Christianity.

This is now considered the definitive biography of Helen Waddell who was born in Tokyo in 1889 of Ulster parents. They returned home while she was still a child so she was educated in Belfast and at Oxford. From there she went on to become a brilliant linguist. 'The Wandering Scholars' her 1927 book on the Goliards, is still considered the defining work on the subject, though she is perhaps best remembered today for her wonderful novel 'Peter Abelard' (1933). She died in 1965.

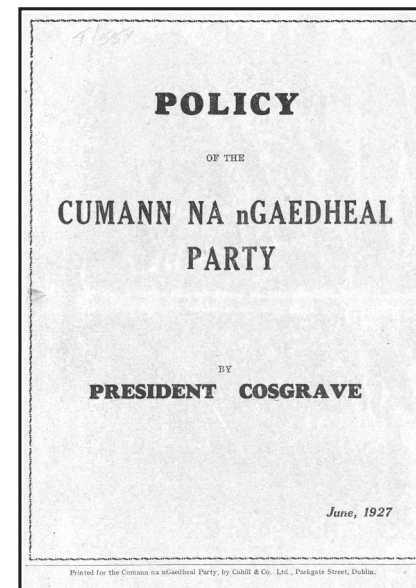

Dublin born (1880) William Thomas Cosgrave became a member of the Irish Volunteers and served under Éamon Ceannt during the 1916 Rising. For this action he was sentenced to death; however, the sentence was commuted to penal servitude and he was released in the 1917 general amnesty. Following the unexpected death of Arthur Griffith and the murder of Michael Collins in 1922 he was appointed President of the Executive Council, a position he held until 1932. Cumann na nGaedheal, which was founded in 1923 by supporters of the Anglo-Irish Treaty remained as a separate party until their defeat in the 1932 election, after which they merged with the Blueshirts and the National Centre Party to form Fine Gael in 1933.

This policy pamphlet was essentially the President's address to the Ard Fheis "on the eve of a General Election" which was held in June 1927.

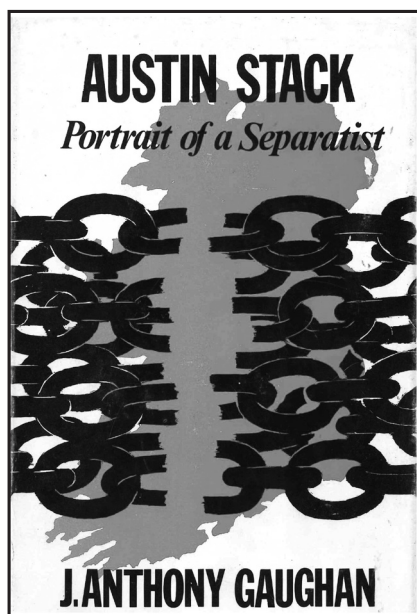

Austin Stack was born near Tralee, Co. Kerry in 1879. After being educated locally he got a job as a solicitor's clerk. In 1908 he joined the I.R.B., quickly becoming an important figure in that organisation. He was sentenced to death for his part in the landing of guns at Banna Strand, but this was commuted to imprisonment for life, however, he was released in the 1917 amnesty. He opposed the Treaty in 1921, fought and was captured in the Civil War. He went on hunger strike for forty-one days, but following his release his health never fully recovered and he died in 1929.

Charles Macklin (McLaughlin) was probably born in Co. Donegal some time around 1700. It is said that his father fought on the Stuart side at the Battle of the Boyne. Educated in Dublin, and with some little experience on the stage there he made his way to London, where after a time he became one of the leading members of the acting profession, particularly lauded for his portrayal of Shakespeare's Shylock. His violent nature led him into many disputes, even on one occasion to killing a fellow actor, for which, though found guilty of manslaughter, he escaped prison. He lived to be a great age, claiming himself to be well over one hundred years old, and died in Covent Garden in July 1797.

This edition of two of his plays was published by subscription to relieve the poverty of his later years, a total of nearly £1600 being collected. There are four previous owners names on the end-papers.

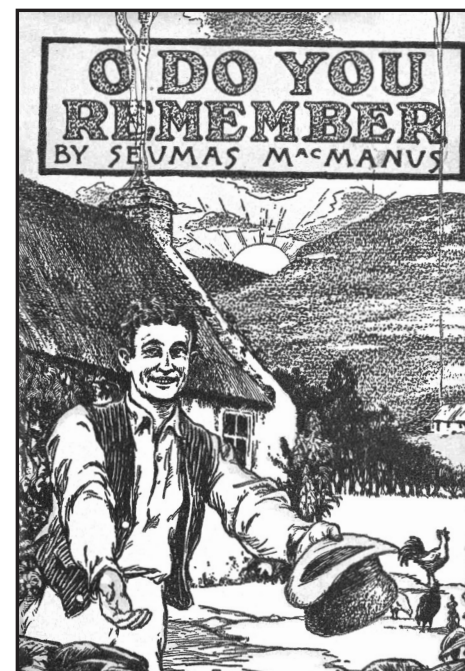

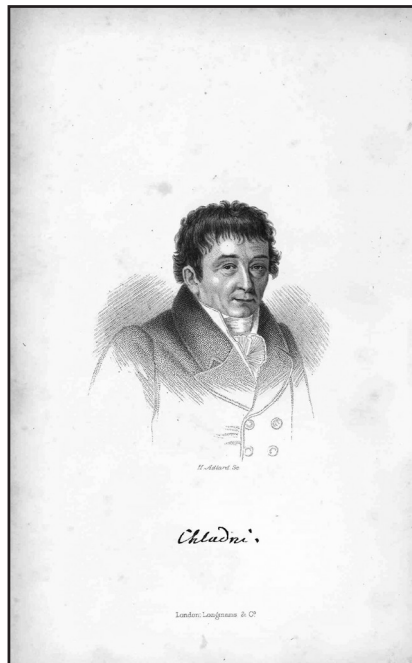

After being educated locally, he went immediately to work for the Ordnance Survey, first in Carlow and afterwards in England. However he soon abandoned this work to take up teaching, but in 1848 went to Marburg University where he graduated with a Ph. D.  
On returning to England he was given the chair of Natural Philosophy at the Royal Institution in 1853 where he showed tremendous ability and was very influential as a lecturer. These lectures and his experiments in physics soon led him to world fame and much controversy, but he never shied away from this. He received numerous honours, including election as President of the British Association, and though he married into the aristocracy, he refused a knighthood.  
He died from an accidental overdose of chloral in 1893.

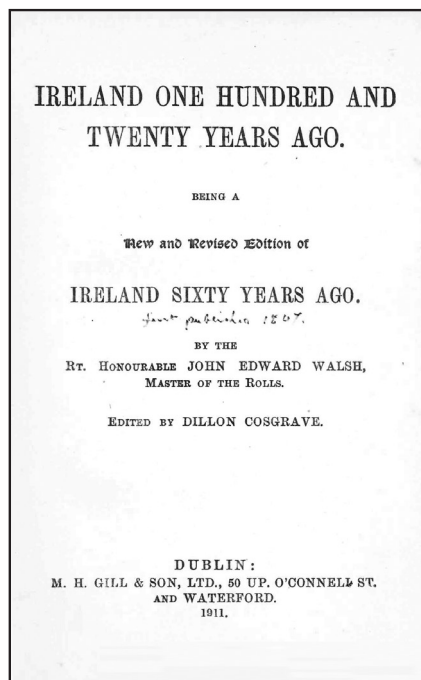
