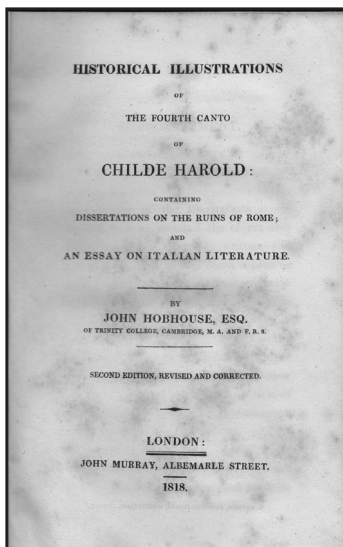

Antoine Frédéric Ozanam was born at Milan, 23 April 1813. Having studied law in Paris, he left there in 1836 when he was appointed to the bench at Lyons. He became a renowned writer and Catholic apologist; however, his main interest for us today is that when but twenty years of age, Ozanam with seven companions had laid the foundations of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, in order, as he said to "insure my faith by works of charity." He died in September 1853.

William Bell was born in July 1924 in Belfast. During WW2 he served in the Fleet Air Arm and following demobilisation he returned to Merton College, Oxford. A keen mountaineer all his life, in August 1948 while holidaying with friends in the Swiss Alps, they decided to climb the Matterhorn, and "in order to save money, to dispense with guides." A grave mistake, as he and two companions "fell some three hundred feet to their deaths."

 Born in Tipperary town in 1830 of relatively well-to-do parents (his father owned some thirty houses in the town), John O'Leary studied law at TCD, but left when he found that barristers were required to take an oath of allegiance to the crown. He then studied medicine at Queen's colleges in both Cork and Galway, but once again did not qualify. His nationalist sympathies led him to become a prominent member of the Fenian movement, for which he was eventually arrested and sentenced to twenty years imprisonment. He served about half of this time before being released and allowed to move to Paris, living there for some years, but eventually returning to Dublin, where he died in 1907. He is greatly remembered for his influence on the young W. B. Yeats.

The parish of Inishkillane in western Ireland is dying. Its young people are far flung from its poor lands and cold seas. ... Inishkillane is the story of hard times in a hard place."
